This is a well-written manuscript with no sign of duplication, plagiarism, or ethical concern. The authors have described their experience in terms of the access governance framework established under the Human, Heredity, and Health in Africa (H3A) consortium, and how to manage the wide access to the data and biospecimen resources collected during various projects.
