The authors have discussed a very important topic and clearly indicate how complicated FGM/C is. They have definitely attempted a thorough investigation of the topic and clearly used qualitative methodology and data analysis technique to investigate the role of the youth group in addressing concerns associated with the practice. While the study is legitimate and serious efforts have been placed in investigation techniques, it was not contextualzed to attend to cultural and perhaps religious inclinations behind the practice.
