- Provide Context for the Methodology:

It would be better if a brief overview of why the chosen approach is considered effective or innovative before discussing the specific novels and their significance is added

- Fascinate the Reader's Interest:

Anecdotes, statistics, or quotes to capture the reader's attention may be added. Incorporating personal experiences or real-world examples of the impact of narrative medicine on end-of-life care can make the article more appealing

- Add strength/ benefits of the article

It may be better if practical strategies for implementing this approach in healthcare settings are elaborated. Tips for selecting appropriate literature, integrating storytelling into patient care plans, and overcoming common challenges and barriers faced by nurses may be incorporated

- Add Potential Limitations

It could be better if potential limitations or criticisms associated with this approach are added. Concerns such as cultural sensitivity, patient preferences, and the need for additional research may be highlighted
