Second, the study would benefit from a more comprehensive literature review of allied studies globally. While the study mentions that integrated coastal management has been the subject of numerous studies in South Africa, it does not provide a clear indication of the existing global literature on coastal access challenges. Including a thorough review of relevant studies from other countries would strengthen the paper's analysis and provide a broader perspective on best practices. Finally, the study should expand on its findings and recommendations.

In conclusion, the study addresses an important research gap and provides valuable insights into the coastal access challenges in South Africa. However, minor revisions are needed to improve the language and grammar, enhance the literature review by incorporating global studies, and provide more explicit findings and recommendations.

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
