Due to the fact that there have been already many different reviews regarding this paper, I would like to make some specific suggestions and (minor) remarks which may help improving the manuscript.

(a) The first two lines of the introductory section are too general. I think that the Introduction should be rewritten in order to better describe the purpose of the paper (e.g., more on the paper's structure).

(b) The "Hicksian Getaway" seems to give prominence to a general problem of economics related to "how an unfounded assertion became a rigid doctrine...". This is a very interesting point and Dr. Jennings may add some comments on this issue.

(c) Page 3, line 10: The author may add a few references with respect to the role of time in economics.

(d) Since Figure One is provided in the main text, a short description of it may be helpful to the readers.

(e) I think that the section "A Return to Nicholas Kaldor's 1975..." is too short and should be expanded or joined with another section
