Due to the fact that there have been already many different reviews regarding this paper, I would like to make some specific suggestions and (minor) remarks which may help improving the manuscript.

- (a) The first two lines of the introductory section are too general. I think that the Introduction should be rewritten in order to better describe the purpose of the paper (e.g., more on the paper's structure).
- (b) The "Hicksian Getaway" seems to give prominence to a general problem of economics related to "how an unfounded assertion became a rigid doctrine...". This is a very interesting point and Dr. Jennings may add some comments on this issue.
- (c) Page 3, line 10: The author may add a few references with respect to the role of time in economics.
- (d) Since Figure One is provided in the main text, a short description of it may be helpful to the readers.
- (e) I think that the section "A Return to Nicholas Kaldor's 1975..." is too short and should be expanded or joined with another section
