This article provides key and detailed information on the importance of Telemedicine (TM) in remote areas and the corresponding ethical issues of TM. Literature reviews address most of the key issues. However, it lacks several impacts of TM - both pros and cons.

TM implementation is not always successful. The reasons behind its failure vary with many circumstances, as providing online healthcare services is more sensitive than the traditional approach. On the other hand, successful implementation is also required to be analysed in order to properly apply TM to target areas. Results of the comparative studies will thus be beneficial to provide applicable TM in the Sub-Saharan area.
