Substance use is quite common among peer groups, and adolescents who do not use may begin to use in order to be included in that group. This situation causes substance use among peers to increase day by day. The disclosure of users among peers by other peers is important for early intervention. However, group relations and fear are among the most important obstacles to this behavior. With this study, the authors have clarified the factors that affect the disclosure of substance use among peer groups positively or negatively. Knowing these factors will guide future intervention studies. Are the values related to age in the first row? I recommend checking.
