It was found that this manuscript was not written strictly in the format of a literature review. The academic nature of the manuscript is not enough, but rather more like a summary report. I suggest the following points: (1) Explain the online learning experience and lessons learned during the COVID-19 epidemic in different points to make the logic of the manuscript clearer; (2) Highlighting the empirical research papers on this topic, identifying the commonalities and characteristics of teaching from evidence-based research; (3) According to the policy literature of each country or region, and combining the research literature of each country, explain the reasons behind these teaching problems during the COVID-19 epidemic, not just the phenomenon; (4) These teaching issues should have different disciplinary personality characteristics, which need to be taken into account when summarizing. Therefore, it is recommended to make greater revisions to make this article more meaningful.
