The paper is a review of the actions implemented by leadership in Public Health during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The methodology of the literature review could be describe more thoroughly. For example detailing how articles were selected, specifying the criteria of article selection, identifying the scientific databases consulted and outling the number of people involved in the selection and analysing process.

The observations resulting from the review seem somewhat superficial and general. A representative of leadership or someone interested in those competentences should gain only a basin understanding of the topic without appreciating the specific areas where certain actions are more effective than in others.

Probably, the importance of previous experience, culture and political are not examined in depth, nor is the composition of public health leadership explored in terms of ensuring good or optimal management of a pandemic.

In conclusion, some minor revisions may be necessary to enhance the overall quality of the review. It should be emphasised that the results cannot be considered absolute, as they represent only a portion of the available literature on the topic under analysis.
