

Review of: "The antithetical relationship of Entrepreneurship and Corruption on Radicalization among the Moroccan Youths: An Empirical study"

The paper investigates an interesting phenomenon of the relationship of between entrepreneurship and corruption, and radicalization among the Moroccan youths. It is based on a survey data from 1746 Moroccan citizens in the Middle Atlas region.

Though the sample seems to be relevant for the Moroccan youth, it would be interesting to compare the results using the same/similar methodology for different countries in the same region. As for the methodology, I would suggest using some refinements and other models of data interpetations (e.g. binary logistic regression).

Finally, this is a one-time shoot study, and it could be interesting to use Machine Learning (both the classification and regression algorithms) to determine specific feature importance and partial dependence between the feature variables and the outcome variable.
