

Review of: "On Violence: an Exchange with ChatGPT — ChatGPT and Suman Gupta"

As other reviewers have mentioned, this article is interesting, but lacks a depth of analysis. Effectively, this is a transcript of a single interview between the researcher and ChatGPT. This is certainly a novel concept, and I believe there is much we have to learn as conversational Als continue to gain sophistication. Much as we probe the understandings of human actors in society, we will need to grapple with how the Als we increasingly rely on understand that society. Work like this can serve as a starting point in probing that understanding (to the extent that current conversational Al models can be said to 'understand' anything). However, without analysis and linkage to relevant literature, there are significant limits in what this article on its own is able to contribute. For future refinement of the project, I recommend deepening engagement with relevant literature and a thorough content analysis of the interview itself. It may also benefit the researcher to conduct multiple interviews, either across multiple instances of the same version of ChatGPT or even a more systematic comparison of responses by a range of current conversational Al models.
