The proposal about "Startup Project Development: Travel Schedule Management App "Triplanner"" sounds well, although there are lacks and mistakes. To improve, try to do it:

-Abstract. You need to add a clear conclusive sentence about the project.

-Theoretical framework. It is the weakest part of the article. With only 5 references, and three of them very ancient (2005, 2005 and 2007), the article must incorporate more indexed scientific citations. If not, it doesn't accomplish the minimum of this kind of articles.

-Methods. The used Method is not standard, because it is like a business plan, and not an article *stricto sensu*. I suggest, if you can (it depends on the time you have), to complete the paper with qualitative sources, for example in-deep interviews, or a Delphi. Perhaps in-deep interviews are not possible in this moment, but expert brief interviews (a Delphi) can allow an added value. It is a recommendation.

-Results. Results are improvable for the explained reasons.

-Conclusion and discussion. There is not discussion, because you don't have enough references in the theoretical part. You can adapt conclusion (and discussion) if you include another method.
