The paper is great; it is very personal and reflective. It reads like a strong and mature philosophical text on the ontology of the 'I'. I really appreciate positioning of the frictions between the normative and the traverse with respect to sexual and gender identity at a very personal moment for the author. The frictions between being or having an 'I' and not having one are exemplified brilliantly! The language is eloquent and precise in how the 'I' is being reconfigured from its normative system of grammatical index.

At times at felt that the use of readings were somewhat unconnected into a singular strand but I feel that this was intentional and in line with the overriding message that is being constructed. I would also redact some awkward references to Wikipedia – I think that the other quotations are very strong and the wiki-reference just brings the narrative somewhat down. – these are just small comments – Overall, I genuinely enjoyed reading the text and I am grateful that it was shared with me.
