

## Review of: "Why the Standard Definition of Creativity Fails to Capture the Creative Act"

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Anna's writing becomes interesting as it explores creativity from two perspectives: internal and external frames. The internal perspective examines the experience of the creative process, while the external perspective focuses on the creative products. Essentially, this is a classic dialectic: do we look at the product or the process, or both? Anna critically examines the standard definition of creativity when measuring creative products. Meanwhile, attention to creativity arises from the world of arts and crafts, which is not inherently related to various standardized measures. This includes exploring the controversies between the internal experiences of creative individuals and the external standards applied to the creative products they produce.

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
