Here in this paper, it is not clear if the author agrees or disagrees with any of their references, and there is no logical flow or link from the past work to the present research question. Also, the significance of this study and the justification of its importance are not addressed strongly. Moreover, the methods section is written in one sentence without any details about method, material, procedure, and design. Additionally, the results, discussion, and conclusion sections are again a series of dot points from other research findings. Overall, the paper needs several revisions to make a scholarly contribution to the field.



In a well-designed research and well-constructed paper, the different threads of ideas would be woven into a fine tapestry. In this paper, all the threads are hanging loosely, and hence the objective and nature of the research are not clear.
