To improve the clarity of the search methods, the authors should consider writing the Boolean operators used, such as AND, OR, and NOT.

The following sentence should be in the results section instead of in the methods section: "Following our search, 849 articles were identified (Figure 2). Duplicates were removed, and 770 records were excluded based on incompatible titles and abstracts. Other articles were excluded because the article's outcome was not relevant to our objectives (3), only abstract data was available (11), three were reports (no primary data), and one was a field test."

I recommend the acceptance of the study titled "A Systematic Review of Antibiotic Use in Humans in Nigeria and Its Potential Contribution to Rising Antimicrobial Resistance" for publication. The study addresses a critical public health issue by systematically reviewing antibiotic use in Nigeria and its potential role in the increasing antimicrobial resistance. The methodology is well written, but still, some revision should be considered. The findings are significant and provide valuable insights that can inform policy and interventions to combat antimicrobial resistance in Nigeria.
