Review of: "Reproducing Misogyny: The Indian and Malayali Manosphere"

This work shows much promise, but feels to me more like a preliminary survey of this important new territory (i.e., the Indian 'manosphere') that will ultimately serve towards the development of a more well-focused and theoretically informed contribution to knowledge in this area.

As I suggest, focusing on Global South incarnations of this male-centred online phenomenon is a much-needed shift in related scholarship, but as it stands, the article needs to do more to justify itself as a work of peer-reviewed scholarship than simply map out the broad contours and key subcultures of the phenomenon. This might make a great blog or journalistic account, but the author needs to dig deeper and see this work as part of a longer-term development towards something genuinely substantive in the scholarly sense. I wish the author all the best in continuing this promising work.
