

Review of: "The Psychological Impact of Leisure and Rehabilitation Activities in Children With Autism: A Delphi Approach"

The article is consistent; however, some improvements will definitely benefit the study explained in this article:

- 1. It is not clear how the author came up with the set of activities listed.
- 2. In certain places where standardized techniques like the Delphi method are explained, it would have helped to provide some relevant citations.
- 3. The paper title indicated the target population was children with autism, but the pilot study actually involved adolescents (ages 10-19, according to the WHO).
- 4. More population demographics and details about their preferences and physical abilities, autism level, etc., would have made their findings more robust; for instance, it is not clear if an ASD child will be emotionally engaged with a physically demanding leisure activity if the child is less active physically in its usual routine.
- 5. The inclusion of a proper conclusion to the paper would have enabled the author to organize the information better and also provide the appropriate flow to suggest future directions better.

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
