The article is interesting and relevant to the field. Here are my comments for improvement on the article.

1. Abstract - It is suggested for the authors to add a brief description on the problem statement of the work in the abstract. I believe this will add to the understanding on the motivation of the work.
2. Introduction - It is suggested for the authors to also include some statistics or past cases that related to physical and mental well-being as well as the rate of absenteeism from work especially from the Nigerian perspective if available. I believe, this will further supports the last statement made in the Introduction section, "According to the Joint ILO/WHO (1995), occupational health should aim to advance and uphold the highest level of physical, mental, and social well-being for workers in all fields; prevent absenteeism from work due to their working conditions; and protect workers from risks (Kaynak et al., 2016; Dunmade et al., 2019; Amedome, 2017)."
3. Introduction-It is also suggested for the authors to discuss on the problem statement of the work in the introduction section.
4. Methodology-It is suggested for the authors to briefly describe the Taro Yamane method in the section.
5. Methodology-In the methodology section, it was mentioned that 'Out of the 400 copies administered, 385 were useful for the analysis done with the descriptive test and the inferential statistics'. How did you decide if the data is udeful or not? what are the factors involved?
6. Discussion-In the discussion section, it was mentioned that "...however, it is scientifically justifiable to reject the null hypothesis one, which states that "there are no significant factors influencing the health and safety programme of the selected electricity distribution companies in Nigeria.", why does it justifiable? Kindly elaborate on the decisions to reject the null hypothesis one.
