

Review of: "The Nexus between Energy Policies and Supply: A Descriptive Evaluation of Nigeria and UK Energy Sectors"

This article presents a descriptive evaluation of Nigeria and the United Kingdom energy on the background of the nexus between energy policy and supply. My major concern however is “why the authors are describing an already existing energy policy”. There is lack of in-depth synthesis of the actual issue. Are you saying the energy generation is sufficient enough, while supply is the problem? The nexus (link) between energy policy and supply is neither well addressed nor presented.

These are other concerns for the article.

1. Your introduction is a literature review of Nigeria’s energy sector, rather than a general background of “The Nexus between Energy Policies and Supply”.
2. Your literature review is describing energy and energy policies independently. Where is the nexus between the energy policies and supply?
3. I honestly don’t understand the context of your methodology. The grammar is rather too ambiguous. This is not a methodology for assessing or describing energy.
4. “However, for the fact that complete data for Nigeria and UK are only available from 1971 – 2020, the first-period review under UK 1870 – 1949 will be subsumed in the second period 1950 – 1979 and analyzed as 1971 – 1979.” Why this statement? Your statistics presents data from the 1970s to the late 1990s. Are you saying there is no recent data? perhaps you should get up to date data if you source properly. You shouldn’t be drawing conclusions based on rather obsolete data.
5. I suggest you do a coherent synthesis of the most recent energy policies between the two nations (particularly Nigeria) and update your result statistics to the year 2020 at least. That way your conclusions will be more robust.
6. There are some serious grammatical issues with this article. Try to address them. Perhaps and English editing service is needed.
