I appreciate the effort you have put in to bring together a important piece of work. More than suggestions for review, I have queries regarding some of the design/methodological decisions that you have made with regard to:

- 1. Going for a selective literature review instead of an exhaustive systematic review
- 2. How and why do you narrow down to epidemiological methods
- 3. The history is largely pertaining to the health research in the context of disasters, is there a specific reason for this focus, and if I have understood you correctly, would it be possible to make this focus explicit.
- 4. As the paper claims of the larger field of disaster research and focuses on epidemiological research, the finding seem to be missing out the larger field and its updates or history.
- 5. If the discussion and conclusion section could substantiate/demonstrate how each of the interpretations are arrived at using the literature review, it would add more rigor to the arguments being made by the paper.
