- 4. I believe the levels of the chemicals in the plant materials have been tested. What are the active ingredients in the various food items that have been tested in vitro before proceeding to in vivo testing. Is it possible to establish the various concentrations of the different chemicals?
- 5. Are the various drugs suggested properly validated?
- 6. It would be a good mini review if it was carefully restructured and would help in the efforts of controlling dengue.

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
