

Review of: "Incidence risk of major reproductive disorders of dairy cows and cow-level risk factors in Wolaita Sodo town, southern Ethiopia"

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Despite not bringing any scientific novelty, it is important at a local level due to the characterization of the herds.

However, some relevant data is missing for this characterization, such as the health status of the herds, vaccination and deworming, mainly because they are talking about reproductive diseases.

And from that point of view, it remains to be defined what they consider abortion/time of, the cause of dystocia (maternal /fetal) or the definition of metritis and endometritis.

They also do not tell us how long was the follow up, one year, two years?

As for data analysis, we know nothing about whether the sample is normal, and what statistical test was used, being important to know how the variables were analyzed.
