- 1. There is this sentence (last sentence on second paragraph under Introduction): "According to the press statement by the Ministry of Health (MOH) after the 42 days of the second lockdown, there was a consistent drop in daily cases reported for the newly-confirmed infected and the number of death cases." Question: When exactly was this statement made?--Date.
- 2. This statement: "As a result, poor households, mostly those engaged in the informal sector, are dropping the number of meals they munch through from three to one or at most two days (Iranmanesh et.al., 2022)." Do you mean "at most twice a day"? for the italic bolded last 4 words above.
- 3. Dedicate a separate subsection, say 3.5, to Testing of Hypothesis. This makes it easier to follow the deductions and the drawing of conclusions based on the hypothesis made and tested.
- 4. The article is generally well written apart from the observations above. It largely portrays what is actually the bare reality on ground as a result of Covid_19. Its recommended for publication after fixing the minor errors/omissions above.
