Dear authors, I appreciate the opportunity to evaluate your work. The topic is interesting, especially as it relates to the study of education and training strategies in nursing within the Islamic culture. The extensive introduction explores relevant aspects of the topic.

Regarding the methodological aspect, I think that some aspects could be better elucidated to enable research reproducibility. In this direction, the methodological approach could be better detailed: How many students were included in the research? Were there any refusals to participate? I would like to know how the students were recruited and if their selection was based on convenience. Did the collaging activity integrate any process of curricular discipline assessment? What was the relationship of the researchers with this group of students?

On another aspect, although the narratives are rich regarding the students' experiences, I couldn't comprehend how the authors derived thematic insights from the empirical data. Finally It would be important to provide more details on how ethical norms were addressed, such as obtaining approval from a research ethics committee, among others.
