I do not have many other disagreements with the content of the article, but my main concern is with one of the limitations, and I quote, "due to limited space, this study did not specifically list the scores and correlations for each item of each scale, and more detailed analyses will be presented through other articles." I disagree with this approach. It is possible to present the scores and correlations for each item of each scale as supplementary material.

Without taking a look at this information, it may not be right to assume, but unless absolutely necessary, multiple papers should not be written for something that can be presented as a supplementary, and doing so may be construed as salami slicing.

As more information is not available, I am unable to make a definitive recommendation in this regard.
