- 1. The Title of the project is well constructed as the independent and the dependent variables could well be seen.
- 2. The abstract is well written to contain what readers should expect to see. It contains a brief background, objective, methods used to achieve the objective, and the results.
- 3. Introduction is well written with in-text citations related to the issues under contention. They are also current. The perceived direction is well articulated at the tail end of the introduction.
- 4. The conceptual framework is the Technology Acceptance Model (TAM) for the measurement. The authors well supported the TAM with Pajava et al., 2021.
- 5. The model measured, 1) perceived usage of technology as H1; 2) perceived usefulness as H2, with appropriate citations as justification.
- 6. And other variables for measurement.
- 7. The variables were tested with the appropriate indicators, which proved their authenticity.
- 8. Analysis of the results is accurate.
- 9. With these observations on the topic, I strongly recommend it for publication with minor review to check for any grammar.
