

Review of: "Emotional Intelligence and Cybervictimization: Stratified Multilevel Analysis With Synthetic Data"

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I don't have the statistical expertise to give an opinion on the statistical processing carried out. My general opinion is that the article is very technical and perhaps too technical. The point of the study for victims of cyberbullying is lost. A discussion of the results without statistics and placing the victim at the heart of the discussion would make the point clearer. The value of identifying risk factors for cyberstalking could also be discussed. Is there a risk of stigmatising certain people or a risk of blaming the victims? Can anything be done with these results from a prevention point of view?

To sum up, I think the study is rigorous, but we mustn't lose sight of the human element when disseminating research results, and we need to think carefully about the role and value of statistics in psychology.

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
