Positive inputs

- 1. The attempt by Reddy et al. to examine the extent of convergence of various development and social welfare programs with the SDGs at the village level is appreciable.
- 2. The attempt to address the research gap in studies analysing the convergence of welfare schemes with SDGs using household-level data is commendable.
- 3. The attempt to match various welfare schemes with SDGs is good.

Inputs for improvement

- 1. In the literature review section, the authors could have included studies from other emerging economies that analyse the convergence of welfare schemes with SDGs using household-level data.
- 2. The village survey is from 2017. Developments since 2017 might have impacted the compatibility of welfare schemes in achieving SDGs.
- 3. Table 3 speaks of SDGs and the number of schemes meeting the concerned goal. For example, 26 programs are meeting SDG-1. It is not clear from the study the basis on which such conclusions are drawn.
- 4. Too many items are included in Figure 3. Ease of understanding this visualization is difficult.
- 5. Check the display error for R² in Figures 7 & 8.
- 6. Typographical errors on page 26 at 1st & 2nd para (Your study)
