

Review of: "From Baking Competitions To Forced Repatriations: Patriotic Alternative And The Hybridity Of The Radical Right"

I found this to be an interesting and timely article. The article is important in that it draws attention to an up-and-coming radical right party which has hitherto received little scholarly attention. It appears to have been thoroughly researched and, importantly, is anchored in a conceptual discussion of radical vs. extreme and far right parties, while the roots of the party are also discussed within the context of the British right-wing. In my view, the article's discussion of the party's (re)introduction of race in its discourse is also highly relevant. As such, the article certainly has the potential to be an important addition to the literature. However, my main criticism is that, although the author structures his argument around the concepts of "authentic" and "inauthentic" nationalism (linked to "good" and "bad" nationalism), these terms are not, in my opinion, given adequate explanation and critical appraisal in the article.
