In the methodology section, the sentence "The socio-economic variables used to assess the factors and predictors of SAM were age, gender, place, ecological zone of residence, ethnicity, level of education, occupation, monthly income, family members, kitchen garden, access to toilet facility, number of children in the family, occupation, and land ownership." is difficult to interpret because it is not clear to whom the variable age (child or mother?), occupation (mother or father?), etc refers

In the result section, I don't have anything to say, I don't understand why you didn't use a stepwise logistic regression that would have identified the significant variables and how they affect them
