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This is a well-written manuscript overall. I would like to suggest the following points to further enhance the clarity and depth of the content. By addressing these points, the paper will provide a more comprehensive analysis of the intersection between LLMs and education.

- Consider including the term "*generative AI*" in the abstract to highlight the relevance of this rapidly evolving field.
- The manuscript references "education" in a broad sense. Please specify whether this refers to elementary education, such as mathematics or physics, or specialized education, such as medicine, engineering, or pharmacology. Providing more context will help readers better understand the scope of your discussion.
- Known challenges with LLMs include bias, fairness, hallucinations, privacy protection, accountability for incorrect outputs, and the potential risk of displacing human jobs. The authors are encouraged to discuss how these issues might specifically impact the field of education in practice. For example, how could bias or hallucinations affect teaching accuracy? Or, what are the implications of privacy concerns in educational settings?
