- Authors say 'evidence-based medicine has become synonymous with large-scale randomized controlled trials (RCT)" This should be corrected thus:
 - 1. Evidence medicine is based on the analyses of various evidences generated from randomized clinical trials using systematic reviews and meta-analysis.
- Authors presented more of a case series in this report. There is need to rearrange the flow and presenting to reflect the discussion- brief background on the use of herbal products, case presentation, discussion, conclusion, recommendation, references
- 3. The title did not reflect the content. I suggest a change in title. consider -COVID-19 Pandemic : A Case Series on the Use of Herbal Supplements
