I appreciate this article. However, I don't think this is an academic article. This article does not meet academic standards. Firstly, the title is very confusing and difficult to understand. I found no connection between "indigenous law" and Rohingya refugees. If so, which indigenous law? The author should focus on the indigenous laws of certain regions, for example, Aceh law (qanun).

Secondly, the abstract needs to be reformulated.

Third, in the introductory section, it is not clear what problem is being raised. Data and statistical claims must be proven through reliable sources, not from online news clips.

Fourth, the discussion is not in-depth and unfocused. The author must improve the formulation of the problem so that later it can become a guide in the discussion section.

Fifth, the conclusion is not in line with the background and discussion.

Sixth, the reference section is very poor and does not reflect academic standards.

Seventh, the overall structure is not very logical.

Finally, the author must completely change the structure and substance of this article, add more references and supporting data, and it is better to go to a native translator.
