I have some ideas to improve this model:

- 1. How can this model relate to locational transferability (Hasan et al., 2012) of factors of hurricane evacuation?
- 2. In light of Mannering's (2018) concept of temporal instability of factors influencing evacuation, how does the PBM account for this in its approach?
- 3. It would be beneficial if this paper could provide more insights into how the specific predictors of hurricane evacuation (Tanim et al., 2022) fit into the broader framework of the PBM.

Finally, this paper is an important contribution to the field of hurricane preparedness and provides a valuable framework for understanding and promoting protective behavior.
