Section 3.1.2. :

P1-line 4, review if date data are right, because a see a letter "a" after the second year.

P2-line 7, where sentence is "over social institutions because of their ability to instill fear in them (Harvey, 2009. Men's" is missing a parenthesis between the point and the word "Men's" to set the right syntax of the reference.

Section 3.3.1.:

Line 10, I think that the word "experiential" does not provide formality or is poorly written, since, in my experience, I would use it to communicate ideas but in a more colloquial language.
