Methodology:

## Quantitative part:

- · Add a reference for STATA
- Vaccination guidelines in Bangladesh. To understand the vaccine timing and schedule, you must include it in the
  article.
- Questionnaire for KAP: The authors should describe the questionnaire as an existing tool, briefly describe its
  psychometric properties, and provide references to its original development. If it's a new tool, you should describe the
  steps undertaken to develop and test it, and if this was not done, authors should mention it along with its potential
  limitations.

### Qualitative part:

- How was the key informant selected?
- What methodological orientation was stated to underpin the qualitative study part?
- How many people refused to participate or dropped out? Reasons?
- Where was the data collected? e.g., home, clinic, or workplace
- Was anyone else present besides the participants and researchers?
- Were questions, prompts, and guides provided by the authors? Was it pilot-tested?
- · Were repeat interviews carried out? If yes, how many?
- · Data saturation needs to be discussed.
- · How many data coders coded the data?
- Which coding approach did the authors use in the study?
- · Were themes identified in advance or derived from the data?
