Firstly, the *Journal of the National Cancer Institute (JNCI)* is registered in the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office. Authors can add the following sections to further elaborate:

The JNCI (print ISSN: 0027-8874, online ISSN: 1460-2105) is a peer-reviewed journal that publishes 12 issues per year in print and online. *JNCI* is published monthly by Oxford University Press and is not affiliated with the United States National Cancer Institute. The journal publishes manuscripts that describe novel findings of significance in cancer research with a particular focus on clinical, epidemiologic, behavioral, and health outcomes studies.^[1] *JNCI* publishes Articles, Systematic Reviews (with or without Meta-analysis) and Meta-analyses, Brief Communications, Correspondence, Invited Responses, Editorials, Commentaries, Reviews, MiniReviews. *JNCI* has an Impact Factor of 9.90 (Clarivate, 2023), and a CiteScore of 18.3 (Scopus, 2022).

- Journal of the National Cancer Institute Monographs

JNCI Monographs (Print ISSN 1052-6773, Online ISSN 1745-6614) is part of the *Journal of the National Cancer Institute* family of journals. *JNCI Monographs* publishes manuscripts from key conferences handling cancer and closely related research fields, or a related group of papers on specific subjects of importance to cancer research.^[2] *JNCI Monographs* is published by Oxford University Press. The journal had a CiteScore of 7.6 in 2022 (Scopus).

- Journal of the National Cancer Institute Cancer Spectrum

JNCI Cancer Spectrum (Online ISSN 2515-5091) is a peer-reviewed, open-access journal that publishes 6 issues per year online. The journal publishes manuscripts describing new findings of particular significance across a full range of clinical and translational cancer research, including prevention, screening, and treatment, as well as clinically relevant epidemiologic, public health, and policy research. *JNCI Cancer Spectrum* publishes Articles, Systematic Reviews (with or without Meta-analysis) and Meta-analyses, Brief Communications, Correspondence, Invited Responses, Editorials, Commentaries, Reviews, MiniReviews.^[3] The journal also invites scholarly manuscripts discussing emerging hypotheses and research priorities. *JNCI Cancer Spectrum* is published by Oxford University Press. *JNCI Cancer Spectrum* recently received its inaugural Impact Factor of 3.4 (Clarivate, 2023) and boasts a CiteScore of 6.9 (Scopus, 2022).
