This article is publishable but its “missiological perspective” needs to be improved as it explored ecological theology from a missiological perspective and considered the global crisis of the whole life system as a catastrophe of the modern industrial world. Authors argue that this is ‘a crisis that humans have brought on themselves and their natural environment’ and this is an important argument. However, there is a need to also give examples of practical activities such as mining, carbon emissions and others from the Indonesian perspective.

The authors conducted a qualitative study but the method needs a deeper theological grounding in mission studies as the topic suggests. This compromised the quality of discussion and conclusion. I suggest that the authors improve on their reflection on missiology because there is a lot of recent scholarly work on the subject of missiology and ecotheology.
