Thanks for preparing the article! After reading the manuscript, I wish to suggest a few modifications that can improve the framework and flow of the research. I hope these comments will enhance the readability for the research world.

- 1. Title: The title could be a bit concise to give an overall idea of the research instead of elaborating too much.
- 2. Abstract: Could pinpoint the (a) name of the ecological economic model adopted, (b) main outcomes, and (c) what exactly this paper did to improve the research in a few sentences instead of more general statements.
- 3. Ask a problem: Could involve gathering research along this study area, similar models, and methodologies adopted by other researchers as a literature review. It would be great if the authors could include some outdated or updated articles too.
- 4. Research methods (2.2 section): Can brief about the models used for the study. Detail the components considered, etc.
- 5. Results: How authors linked climate change to the survey is still questionable? It would be great to read more explanations connecting the reduction of production and livestock diseases. One of the main questions that comes to my mind is, Does the survey of 80 households consolidate the image of climate change connecting the ecological-economical changes? Because climate change is a long-term phenomenon, we need years of data to correlate the processes and connect to the changes.
- 6. Conclusions: I wish some outcomes obtained from the survey as numerical values (statistics, magnitudes, etc.) to prove the climate change connection with the study. The values will speak more than general statements.
