- 5. Please delve into the methodology, what days was it applied? during what months of the year? in what schedule? In addition, a table with the characteristics of the total sample (case study, gender, age) and explain how the interview participants were chosen.
- 6. Please add the reference and explain a little more about what these parameters are, security and crime perspective?
- 7. Please check wording: ""(Williams, 2008) builds on the works of Henri Lefebvre in reference to "night time spaces" should be "Williams (2008) builds on the works of Henri Lefebvre in reference to "night time spaces""
- 8. The explanation of how the Likert scales work is in the methodology section.
- 9. Choose Table 3 or Table 2, they present the same information
