1. The title is too wordy, and the content is not relevant to COVID.

The abstract has to be shortened, and it should be maxed at 150 to 200 words.

And the manuscript is also too long.

2. The introduction part has to be little bit reorganised as a brief section of the review of literature follows the introduction section.

3. The introduction section lacks clarity in terms of what the purpose of the study is, what it intends to explain in the further article, and how it is going to help academicians and practitioners.

4. The major findings of the study should clearly be mentioned in the introduction part, and the organisation of the article should be given in the introduction part.

5. Number and citation of most recent/reputed references is insufficient.

6. The major findings of the study should clearly be mentioned in the introduction part.

7. For the proposed approach, the author is suggested to discuss how this type of description could be handled.
