

Review of: "Sustainable TOURISM: win-win-win papakonstantinidis model"

I do not want to repeat some of the comments made in other reviews with which I generally agree. (This is especially true of Pius Siakwah's comments on social justice, please also look at "Sustainable Tourism: A Human-Centered Approach", https://www.mdpi.com/2071-1050/13/4/1835). However, I would like to emphasize one very important (in my opinion) feature of this text. The author presents a 'hard', quantified method of measuring sustainability (even if this method requires some technical improvements). This is quite rare in the literature discussed. There are many more conceptual, descriptive, sometimes ideological and declarative articles and other publications on sustainable development (including tourism sustainability); and only a few (mainly narrow case studies) that address the issue on a concrete empirical basis. To sum up, the strength of this work and applied approach is mainly the research method used, which is universal, i.e. it can be used in various circumstances. I highly recommend the article as one of the rare attempts to tackle the issues of sustainable tourism using 'hard' models.
