- The dates defined for the study do not coincide between the article abstract (2015-2019, July), Introduction (2015 – 2019, August) and section 3. Research Method (2015-2022, August). Also, in abstract and section 3., the keywords for searching the bibliography do not match.
- In section 4.1. Distribution of Articles According to Publication Years, the statement “So, we can say that the publication number will increase after August 2019” I do not consider correct, since the growth trend can be seen since 2016. I still suggest a graph for this information.
- The layout is not pleasant putting a subtitle (4.2) and then a table (table 2.) without any text in between. Same comment for other similar situations.
- The presented bibliography is outdated considering that it is a study on technology. Also, as indicated in Table 1, there is a growing trend in the publication of articles in this field of study.
- Sometimes, in the text, we only find simple sentences placed as paragraphs... mainly at the end of section 5. Result and Discussion
- It should improve the linguistic connection between paragraphs, as well as between sentences, so that the text has unity.
- I find section 5. Result and Discussion rather poor.
- I'm confused by the conclusion as it seems not to be related to the data presented. For example “We concentrated on 3D AR-based holograms and the web in this line of research to provide disabled elderly people with information in their original language and translations of written words or sentences”. or “Furthermore, we tested approaches for assisting blind users in selecting things from very extensive lists on mobile phones.”
- I suggest that the objectives, data presented, literature discussion and conclusion be reviewed.
