The authors collected a lot of information and the writing style is also fluent. However, the article needs focus. What are the authors trying to review? Is it the analysis part, the microorganisms found in vegetables, or their risk to public health? The article seems to oscillate between these three points without spending sufficient time on either one. Additionally, I have the following suggestions for improvement.

Abstract

"Understanding vegetable spoilage mechanism/ microbial pathogenesis is important."

I think the correct word would be the role of microbial pathogenesis in the spoilage mechanism since all pathways of spoilage are not covered.

The abstract should contain one or two sentences about the aim and scope of the work.

1. Introduction

Pragraph 1

"However, microbiologically spoiled vegetables constitute a potential health hazard for" humans since the spoiled raw and fresh vegetables often serve as vehicles for pathogenic bacteria, viruses, and parasites

I think the word fresh is not needed here.

Pragraph 4

"Knowledge about diseases commonly linked with microbial contamination of vegetables is required especially for health professionals in order to find out the means of protecting the mass public health from vegetable-oriented disease complications."

I think either mass or public health should be used.

The authors should mention some of the available reviews on the topic and point out the gap in the literature; thereby establishing why this review is needed.

Pragraph 1

"Anti-microbial resistance (AMR), including multi-drug resistance (MDR), is a global health public health issue."

1st health should be removed.
