Authors, please kindly correct the 'Results' section - The sample for this study consisted of 359 students [51.1% (n=185) being boys and 48.5% (n=174) being girls], not 358.

Correction required in 'Conclusions' under the abstract. Authors were not testing the instruments QCS and QACSES, so they need not mention "The instruments used are suitable for the initial diagnosis and/or assessment of sexuality." Definitely, by exploring adolescents' knowledge and attitudes about sexuality, authors could have contributed to improving knowledge and the adequacy of interventions so that adolescents' sexual health is more satisfactory and without additional risks.
