

Review of: "Square peg in a round hole: Migration and romantic relationship troubles in the UK Zimbabwean diaspora"

This important article examines the impact of migration on Zimbabwean women living in the UK. This is a clearly under-researched area and population. There continues to be a great need for further understanding of the impact of migration (enculturation and acculturation) on the psychological and physical health of immigrant populations. Ncube and Bentham do a great job adding to this literature by reporting on Zimbabwean women's experience, using a qualitative method, in terms of their marriage experiences, coping and wellbeing. Their findings highlight the impact of structural inequalities on these women's life, including experiences of interpersonal violence. Reading their article, I wanted to learn more about the women in their sample in terms of some demographic variables, such as the length of marriage, age at immigration, employment and level education. Since participants were divorced, I am also interested in learning more about their process of divorce; I hope that Ncube and Bentham continues to publish in this area.
