

Review of: "Answer to Ph.D. Viva Voice Questions by Doctoral Candidates: In the Case of the Ph.D. Thesis Entitled “Determinants of Entrepreneurship Sustainable Development in Africa”: Short Communication"

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This research has the potential to improve students' ability not only in responding to viva questions but also in enhancing their efforts to write their theses effectively.

However, it is important for the author to acknowledge that each thesis is distinct, and the questions posed during viva examinations may differ based on various factors, such as the framework, objective, type of research, sampling methods, data analysis, researchers' perspectives, etc. Based on these factors, sticking to 20 questions does not seem sufficient.

Another consideration is that when students write their theses through personal determination and hard work, they become proficient in addressing most important questions in the Viva. Compared to their supervisors, in some cases, students themselves possess a deeper understanding of their theses as they have done a lot of research and spent a huge amount of time in their own research work. In my experience, most students who are unable to defend themselves in viva are those who cannot answer the viva questions because of not writing their own theses.

To address these issues, the author could conduct interviews with both students and their supervisors to identify the main challenges students face in answering viva questions.

I hope my comments will assist the author to improve his/her work.
