The topic declared in the title is relevant.

However, the elements of the paper are not well structured. The logic of the paper is not comprehensive.

Still, it also depends on the type of the paper. If the author/s just expresses his/her opinion about some aspects connected with the ASEAN Economic Community or English Language Curriculum, the paper type of the paper must be stated as Opinion. Somewhere, the author/s called his paper an Essay. So, the author/s must be sure what type of document he/she publishes. Does the publication of the essay follow the policy of Qeios Journal?

Nevertheless, the paper benefits if the author/s reorders the elements. It is better to follow the following structure: Introduction, Methods, Analysis, Discussion, and Conclusion. If the author/s needs to explain any keywords, it is better to do it at the beginning of the paper.

The Introduction will look more beneficial if the author/s extends it.

The Conclusion section should effectively summarize the main points of the research in order to leave a lasting impression on the reader, so it will look more beneficial if the author/s extends it.

The language is acceptable.

The reference section needs improvement. DOIs must be added to publications; it will be more knowledgeable for readers. It also should be extended.

As for me, the main issue is that readers are looking for substantial research and not just personal opinions. Maybe it is better to change the title (for instance, Sustainable Development in Southeast Asia: A Personal Perspective) in order not to confuse readers.
